## Proclamation

WHEREAS, it is estimated that 6.7 million people currently live with chronic

wounds and that number is expected to grow at more than two

percent annually for the next decade; and

WHEREAS, the rising incidence is fueled by an aging population and increasing

rates of diseases and conditions such as diabetes, obesity and the late

effects of radiation therapy; and

WHEREAS, untreated chronic wounds can lead to diminished quality of life and

possibly amputation of the affected limb; and

WHEREAS, more than 30.3 million people or 9.4 percent of the population have

diabetes in the United States and almost two million of those people will develop a diabetic foot ulcer or other non-healing wounds; and

WHEREAS, advanced wound care aims to prevent amputations and heal patients

in a faster and more cost-effective way by physicians and health care providers who take great pride in caring for their patients, and seeing

them succeed; and

WHEREAS, the goal of Wound Care Awareness Week is to highlight the

importance of advanced wound care and its ability to save lives

and limbs.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, John Bel Edwards, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do hereby

proclaim June 3 - 7, 2019 as

WOUND CARE AWARENESS WEEK
